Interpo's Finest's 5 Principles:

- 1st Principle: We are strictly neutral when it comes to conflicts that occur throughout history, as a result we don't take any side.
- 2nd Principle: We follow the policy of deliberate ambiguity towards morality, in other words we do not share our moral stance towards any subject, for two reasons:
 - Our job is to expose events and not try to conceal them. And to explain ideologies and behaviours and not try to change or spread them, Simply for task specialization purposes.
 - History taught us that Morality changes, what was a virtue yesterday
 may today become a vice and vice versa. therefore it is not
 profitable to hang on to unstable perspective.
- 3rd Principle: in order to better examine a past event, we wait 7 years after its occurrence to talk about it, why? In order to give ourselves sufficient time to hand pick correct informations from the fake ones concerning the event and to collect enough evidences, confessions and testimonies that come out of it. If we ever find ourselves talking about a certain event before it had reached 7 years, we probably use probabilities and guessings and not hard concrete evidences when explaining it.

- 4th Principle: When it comes to covering history, We admit that our storytelling can never be complete and cannot expose every detail it happened in a specific historic event. In other words we give an oversimplified version of what really happened and not the whole story, we encourage people to make further researches.
- 5th Principle: Human nature is always constant and doesn't change throughout history, what change are the resources and behaviours that people use in order to obtain their objectives that in turn satisfy their basic and unchangeable human nature.
